Veterans' Aid and Attendance and Housebound Benefits Information

Veterans and their spouses may be eligible for benefits to help with the cost of care in the home.

To qualify,	the veteran must:
O +	Have received an honorable or general discharge
O +	Have doctor's orders stating he or she needs the aid and assistance of others daily
0	Meet financial requirements
O	lave served 1 day during an active war and had no less than 90 days of service
The survivii veteran's d	ng spouse of a veteran may also qualify providing he or she was still married to the veteran at the time of the leath.
What a	are Aid and Attendance and Housebound Benefits?
	eteran cannot receive both Aid and Attendance and Housebound benefits at the same time, and must be monthly pension in order to qualify for either of these additional benefits.
	Attendance (A&A) is a benefit paid in addition to a monthly pension. This benefit may not be paid withou pension. A veteran may be eligible for A&A when:
ir a	The veteran requires the aid of another person in order to perform personal functions required in everyday living, such as bathing, feeding, dressing, attending to the wants of nature, adjusting prosthetic devices, or protecting himself/herself from the hazards of his/her daily environment, OR ,
_	The veteran is bedridden, in that his/her disability or disabilities requires that he/she remain in bed apart from any prescribed course of convalescence or treatment, OR ,
O T	The veteran is a patient in a nursing home due to mental or physical incapacity, OR ,
_	The veteran is blind, or so nearly blind as to have corrected visual acuity of 5/200 or less in both eyes, or concentric contraction of the visual field to 5 degrees or less.



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
